

The Position

The Water, Wastewater, and Solid Waste Director will lead a team of 52 employees in delivering outstanding service to 7,000 customers both within and outside of the incorporated city limits. The combined department budget is approximately \$16.6 million.

The Department is currently working on implementation of a \$2 billion Navajo Gallup Water Supply Project that will divert water from the San Juan River to the City for treatment and delivery to customers through miles of pipelines and numerous pumping stations. Gallup's Water, Wastewater, and Solid Waste director will have the opportunity to lead this incredible project to fruition.




employee development, and someone who values effective communication.

- State of New Mexico water system operator certification and wastewater systems operator certification within a reasonable time after hire (required).



Compensation & Benefits

The expected starting salary is up to \$120,000.
